
Territory of Greater Geneva

The Geneva metropolitan area is characterised by strong economic and demographic growth. This dynamism has led to important territorial changes and is changing our mobility habits: more and more of us are moving, over greater distances and more frequently.



Travelling in the canton of Geneva


While the focus has been primarily on commuting (for work and studies), it appears that the leisure sector is the main reason for travel with 62% of the distances travelled.






Road network

Current developments of the road network involve redesigns and multi-modal links in connection with the development of new neighbourhoods, the implementation of the urban ring road, the bypass highway and industrial zones.



Public transport

The Léman Express, inaugurated on 15 December 2019, will revolutionise mobility in Greater Geneva. In addition to the regional and cross-border commuter services, the Léman Express offers a real metro service to Geneva. The 5 new stations in the heart of the canton have allowed for strong urban densification and the development of efficient multimodal interfaces.

Big success for the Léman Express



- ~60,000 passengers/day

Revision of parking regulations on private land (reduction of ratios)



Freeing up roads for the economy and professional transport

Simplifying deliveries and construction work, reducing traffic that creates additional costs and nuisances and developing rail transport for stronger cohesion with road transport are all challenges that have been identified in the 1st Swiss Freight and Urban Logistics Action Plan published in 2019.






Ecological transition & mobility

Geneva published its reinforced cantonal climate plan in June 2021. Mobility plays an important role in meeting these objectives, as land mobility accounts for 26% of greenhouse gas emissions in the canton.

Accelerating the implementation of the Coherent and Balanced Mobility Act (CBMA)

The CBMA was approved by nearly 68% of the population of Geneva on 5 June 2016. It defines the operating principles of the canton's transport networks by organising modal prioritisation specific to a territorial zone.



To achieve carbon neutrality in mobility by 2050 and to meet the objectives set for 2030, the canton is developing a new multimodal strategy. Many measures for sustainable mobility are already being planned and implemented.
