## A SINGLE TICKET FOR ALL PUBLIC TRANSPORT

With one single ticket, you can have access to all public transport within Tariff Zone 10, covering the whole of Geneva. This includes trains, trams, buses, and lake shuttles. What's more, the new Léman Express train lines are accessible as well at no extra cost. Ticket prices remain at 3 francs for 1 hour of travel with a full fare adult ticket, or 500 francs for a full fare adult annual subscription.

## DRIVERS AND THE LÉMAN EXPRESS

All stations are accessible by car, meaning you can either pick passengers up or drop them off. You can even use the Léman Express yourself by taking advantage of the car parks and P+Rs available for direct connections with the train. Holders of a P+R subscription or a daily P+R ticket can continue to travel throughout Zone 10, which covers the entire territory of Geneva, under the same conditions as at present. The canton has about 21 P+Rs and 9 Daily P+Rs.

## COMBINE CYCLING WITH THE LÉMAN EXPRESS

In addition to the existing bicycle stations at Cornavin station, five new secure bicycle stations making up 3500 spaces have been added to the Lancy-Pont-Rouge, Lancy-Bachet, Geneva-Champel, Geneva-Eaux-Vives and Chêne-Bourg stations. They are all accessible through the Velocity application. You can also park your bike on outdoor sites near all the stations in the network. And with help from the free Geovélo application, use GPS to better plan your travels.

Multimodality, i.e. the use of several modes of transport when traveling, is part of daily life for an everincreasing number of Geneva residents. There is a very wide range of offers to make mixing up your travel easier, be it for business or for leisure. These include financial benefits in the form of subsidies or preferential tariffs offered by municipal or cantonal authorities.

# **DISCOVER A NEW WAY TO TRAVEL** WITH THE LÉMAN EXPRESS!

Starting on 15 December 2019, Geneva and its metropolitan area will finally be able to rely on an urban and regional rail network, like so many other major Swiss and European cities. This ultramodern cross-border network of 230 kilometres of lines serving 45 French, Vaudois and Geneva stations will make travelling in the region and in the heart of Geneva much easier.

The Léman Express will be an opportunity for every inhabitant of our canton to rethink the way they travel and make their journeys faster and more comfortable. This could be through combining different modes of travel, for example, via bicycle stations and car parks that will offer parking spaces with a direct connection to the train. Or it could be through combining various public transport systems, as with a single fare you can access the whole of Geneva, switching from tram or country

This new travel philosophy applies both to work commuters and to those travelling for leisure. Trains will run 24 hours a day on weekends and from 5:00 a.m. to 12:30 a.m. on weekdays between Annemasse and Coppet. Now you can go by train to the theatre, the beach, sporting events or even


